Description of Services:

- In-Home Family Services: provides the family feedback, instructions, and counseling on how to improve their behavior and relationship. Youth and their families have the opportunity to practice skills learned through in-home counseling by actually utilizing skills and techniques learned on a daily basis as they interact with each other.
- Therapeutic Mentoring: aimed at youth who display unruly or delinquent behaviors, are unsupervised latch-key children, or who need individualized attention not being provided by a caretaker or school. Therapeutic mentoring is offered during the peak hours that children usually get into trouble or are left home alone. Screened and trained mentors provide positive interactions with mentees to help them develop social skills and increase self-esteem.
- Anger Management Classes: open to preteens, teenagers, and adults who have problems managing anger and aggression. Each person has the opportunity to develop an understanding of what causes him or her to empower people to manage their anger without resorting to violence or aggression. Youth and adults learn how to recognize anger, monitor anger, identify personal triggers, and learn the difference between justified and unjustified anger, and develop anger management techniques and ways to get out of difficult situations.



The program includes individual treatment plan, relapse prevention, family services, day treatment services, detoxification services, group and individual therapy, adventure-based therapy, and continuing care.

Description of Services: Addiction in adolescents progresses much faster than in adults. This program, available for young men and women ages 13-18, offers both outpatient and residential treatment, and emphasizes family participation.

- → Residential Program: When a young person is admitted, a complete physical and psychosocial evaluation is performed to determine an individual treatment plan. This plan addresses family dynamics, peer relationships and the consequences of addiction, and includes:
- Medically supervised detoxification
- · Individual and group counseling
- · AA/NA participation
- · Spiritual counseling
- · Family involvement
- · Continuing care/aftercare
- Experiential therapy (ropes course, equine therapy)
- · Therapeutic recreation
- → Outpatient Program: Cumberland Heights' youth outpatient services are for those in the early stages of chemical abuse or dependency. Treatment is scheduled so young people can continue their school and outside responsibilities and ranges from low intensity therapy (generally 3-hour sessions twice a week) to intensive therapy (held three hours a day, four days a week).

Description of Services: Elam Mental Health Center offers an Adolescent Intensive Outpatient drug and alcohol treatment program. It is a 35 day program in which kids meet Monday thru Friday for 7 weeks. The classes are held from 3-6pm each afternoon during the school year, and from 1-4pm during the summer. The program includes:

- Transportation for kids within a 10 miles of the center
- Snacks
- Monthly field trips
- Psychiatric evaluations
- Anger management
- Individual Therapy
- Family and group therapy

This program is available to all adolescents, regardless of whether or not they have insurance. The Elam Mental Health Center also offers drug and alcohol assessments according to the state requirements.

Description of Services: The Adolescent Intensive Outpatient Program at Skyline Madison Campus focuses on adolescent substance abuse along with a wide range of behavioral/emotional issues including mood disorders, self-esteem problems, peer issues, self harming behaviors (such as cutting and eating disorders), and family relationship issues. The program provides counseling for four days (Monday – Thursday) throughout a six-week period, from 4 - 6:30pm, with Thursday being family night. Once the teen completes the six-week program, he or she is encouraged to continue in the aftercare support group for four additional weeks. Additional family counseling is also available as needed.

Urban Housing Solutions

- "Journeys of Hope" is a specific residential facility designed for participants (and their families) who have just left drug rehabilitation centers. - "The Academy" program attempts to transform the lives of men who were incarcerated, addicted to drugs, and/or homeless. Men in the program learn basic job skills during the day, participate in encounter groups, and prepare for the GED at night. The students of the program are considered teachers for each other. Vanderbilt Mental Health Center



Description of Services: The Division of Child & Adolescent Psychiatry provides clinical services for children and adolescents with neuropsychiatric disturbances and trains medical students, residents, and fellows in child and adolescent psychiatry. The program reflects a balanced emphasis on developmental psychopathology, psychodynamic psychiatry and neurobiology. The faculty treats psychosomatic difficulties, alcohol and substance abuse, post traumatic stress disorder and other anxiety disorders, affective disorders, psychotic disorders, and disruptive behavior disorders.

Established in 1969, the child psychiatry residency program provides extensive training in inpatient and outpatient psychiatry and in pediatric consultation-liaison psychiatry. Fellows develop expertise in the treatment of severe psychopathology through rotations in forensic child psychiatry, school-based consultation, and multidisciplinary experience in pediatric child development and pediatric neurology. An array of seminars and research activities invite participation at all levels of the child and adolescent psychiatry training experience.

Vanderbilt also offers an intensive outpatient program for juvenile sex offenders.

Tennessee Voices for Children

Description of Services: Tennessee Voices for Children (TVC) attempts to bridge the gap between professionals and families to form an alliance that works in the best interest of the child. TVC offers a number of programs, including:

- The Tennessee Respite Network: a network of statewide referrals and services for families of children (0-18) with serious disabilities.
- Child Care Consulting Program: provides onsite consultation to parents and teachers of preschools throughout Tennessee. The program addresses topics such as child development, classroom behavior, behavioral screening, etc.
- TeenScreen: Focuses on early identification of adolescent problems, such as depression and anxiety, through education, screening, and treatment.
- Tennessee Parent Information and Resource Center Program (TPIRC): enables parents of pre-school and elementary school-aged children, especially the economically disadvantaged, to effectively help their children meet educational standards and achieve developmental goals. The program encourages schools to actively involve parents in school programs and activities.

Youth Villages Intercept Program



Mission: To help children and families live successfully.

Description of Services: Intercept provides treatment to troubled children and families in their own homes at times convenient for the families. Counselors with small case loads—four to five families—focus on helping the child and family at home, in school, and in the community. The program serves children of any age (infant to 18) who have serious emotional and behavioral problems. Intercept is based on the principles and practices of research-based mental health treatment. Youth Villages' fourteen years of data from on-going outcome evaluation studies have demonstrated that 80% of youth are successful up to two years after discharge from the program, although random assignment clinical studies have not yet established the effectiveness of the program.

Intercept serves a broad population of youth, including those involved with multiple child-serving systems and those at high risk of removal from their families. The program specializes in diverting youth from out of home placements by helping their families safely maintain youth in their home environment. Intercept also focuses on reunification of youth who are in a residential treatment or foster home setting; counselors are skilled at reuniting families even when the child has been out of the home for an extended period.

Mental Health Cooperative



Mission: MHC will assist people with serious and persistent mental illness and children with serious emotional disturbances live successfully in their environments of choice with the least amount of professional intervention possible.

Description of Services: MHC's professionals focus on reducing the impact of the illness through illness management strategies. MHC's psychiatrists, advanced practice nurses, and nurses provide education about the illness, symptoms of the illness, coping skills, medications, and side effect to help consumers fully understand both their illness and their treatment. They work with each consumer on barriers to medication use, such as a lack of efficacy, side effects, or medication costs. Section 8 Housing Assistance



Description of Services: The Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher and Moderate Rehabilitation Programs is a federally funded program managed by the Rental Assistance Department of MDHA. The program helps families find safe and adequate housing in the *private* market and helps cut the cost of rent and utility bills. The homeowners will generally pay 30-40% of the income *or* a minimum or \$50.00 per month for rent/utilities while MDHA picks up the difference. Homes must pass a Housing Quality Standard before being eligible.

The program also offers a Family Unification Program, where Section 8 Assistance is granted to families who have had children removed due to improper housing, and a Family Self-Sufficiency Program, where participants are provided with services to eventually achieve independent status without governmental assistance.

Though the program is currently closed until mid-2009, the necessary forms (Section 8 Registration Form and the Request for Tenancy Approval Form) are available online and must be submitted to the MDHA Rental Assistance Office.

Urban Housing Solutions

Unless a participant is exempt from the 30-hour work requirement, he/she will develop (with the assistance of a work activity contractor) an individualized career plan (ICP). This plan is based on the participant's needs and skills. The ultimate goal of the ICP is to provide a work and training guide that will result in financial independence for the family.

TennCare extended coverage to the Medicaid population and coverage to individuals who were determined to be uninsured or uninsurable, using a system of Managed Care Organizations (MCO).

Tennesseans may apply for Families First and Medicaid or TennCare benefits at their local Department of Human Services county office. Applicants may also apply online or check for potential eligibility by going to "Check Eligibility or Apply for Benefits" section in the upper right hand corner of the screen. Applications are available in English and Spanish. After the online application has been submitted, the applicant will receive an appointment for an interview. In order to determine eligibility for the program, DHS caseworkers may ask for documentation like birth certificates, social security cards, check stubs, bank statements, utility bills, rent receipts, tax returns, and insurance policies. Applicants are notified by mail (within 45 days of the application date) of the eligibility decision.





The faculty treats psychosomatic difficulties, alcohol and substance abuse, post traumatic stress disorder and other anxiety disorders, affective disorders, psychotic disorders, and disruptive behavior disorders.

Established in 1969, the child psychiatry residency program provides extensive training in inpatient and outpatient psychiatry and in pediatric consultation-liaison psychiatry. Fellows develop expertise in the treatment of severe psychopathology through rotations in forensic child psychiatry, school-based consultation, and multidisciplinary experience in pediatric child development and pediatric neurology. An array of seminars and research activities invite participation at all levels of the child and adolescent psychiatry training experience.

Vanderbilt also offers an intensive outpatient program for juvenile sex offenders.

Adult Education:



Description of Services: The TennCare Advocacy Program works for TennCare enrollees, or those eligible for TennCare, who are experiencing difficulty accessing necessary medical care. There are three major components of the TennCare Advocacy Program: advocacy services, children's advocacy services, and outreach services. The TennCare Advocacy Program can help you: work with your MCO to find health care providers, work with your MCO to obtain services, work with your PCP to obtain services, understand how to get and keep your TennCare eligibility, work through the medical eligibility process, get computer errors corrected, file medical appeals, and keep you up-to-date on the latest TennCare information. In addition, the outreach services can help you renew your TennCare, explain to you the application process, and provide you with information on the Department of Human Services (DHS), where you will reapply for TennCare. *All services are provided via phone*.
