## What do you do within the first 24 hours?

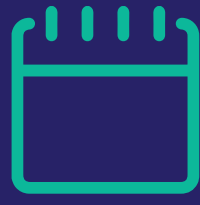

## - BE PREPARED -



### Info You Should Have Ready:

- Your loved one's first and last name
- Their date of birth
- If possible — the arresting agency



### Info You Need To Get:

- Where they are housed
- Charges
- Bail Amount
- First Court Date



### Info You Need To Give:

- Proof of family support
- Proof of community ties
- Proof your loved one is not a flight risk.

## - TAKE ACTION -

# 1.



### Find them on Davidson County's Inmate Search:

<http://dcso.nashville.gov/>

Type in their first and last name and date of birth (DOB) to find out where they're housed, what's their bail, and when their next court date is.

# 2.



### If they're not in the system yet, call the Jail directly at: **(615) 862-8123**.

Ask them what are the charges, are they felonies or misdemeanors, what is their bail, when is their first court date, and where are they housed.

# 3.



### Once you have identified the charge, call the Pre-trial Services at: **(615) 862-7673**

Tell them your loved one has family and community ties and is not a flight risk – share any information regarding employment, school, residency in the county, and family.

# 4.



### If your loved one has an urgent medical issue, call the Medical Clinic at **(615) 862-8123** and ask for the medical staff.

They can't give you information about your loved one without the proper release, but you can give the jail information that can be useful for their medical and/or mental health care.

# 5.



### If they are not released, show up to their **first court date** and ask to speak with the public defender before court.

Show them documentation that the person has family and community ties and is not a flight risk.

# 6.



### Document what you know about the **arrest**.

Write down everything you know about the incident - who, what, where, when, and how. Share this information only with the defense attorney and do so as soon as possible.

## - TIPS -

- Write everything down: names of who you spoke with, times you called, what was discussed.

- Don't discuss case with loved one on the phone.

*(They are recorded and can be used against them.)*

- Keep going until you get answers and keep working with the defense attorney through the court process.
